The Center for Global Justice is an international, educational and research network dedicated to progressive social change. We support social movements that contend "another world is possible." We help them *imagine* that world.

The Center has two main goals. First is to form a global network of members who gather, analyze and disseminate information on the world-wide effects of corporate globalization. The second is to explore and share workable and just solutions to the social and economic problems caused by neoliberal policies.

The Center for Global Justice was formed in 2003 by a small group of educators and labor leaders in the bilingual and multicultural community of San Miguel de Allende in the state of Guanajuato, Mexico.



The Center is already building on impressive achievements. In its first two years, it successfully mounted two international and bi-lingual conferences. The first in 2004 was the "Workshop on Alter-globalizations" and in 2005 the theme was "Women and Globalization." The two self-financed conferences attracted a combined attendance of more than 350 people from more than twenty different countries. Our 2005 conference commissioned research teams to study migration, water, sovereignty and sustainable development and report to the 2006 conference, which is entitled: "Another World is Necessary: Justice, Sustainable Development and Sovereignty."
